## CAJUN STUD

## **Rules of Play**

#### Game Description

Cajun Stud (the "Game") is a house-banked, poker-based, card game played with a standard 52-card deck of playing cards. The object of the Game is for the player to achieve a poker hand that triggers a winning event against a paytable. Cajun Stud also contains several optional bonus wagers, which are won if a player's hand achieves a predetermined winning event posted on the corresponding paytables.

### Ante and Play Wagers

- 1. To begin the game, each player must make an Ante wager. Each player may also place an optional Pocket Bonus, Board Bonus, Lo Ball, or an All Six wager.
- 2. The first four cards dealt from the shoe are given to the dealer and placed in the designated All Six card square. The dealer will then slide the top 3 cards face down to the center of the table into the 3 squares for designated for the community cards. The fourth card will remain in the designated All Six box.
- 3. Each player then receives two hole cards, face down. Each player will use the 3 community cards to form their own five card poker hands.
- After examining their two hole cards, each player must then decide to do one of the following:
  - Players may to choose to place a Raise wager. This wager must be 1x, 2x, or 3x their original Ante wager. After all wagers have been placed the player's two cards shall be placed face down in front of the betting area closest to the Dealer.

- b. Players may choose to Fold. If a player Folds they surrender their Ante wager. If the Player chooses to Fold and had previously placed an optional side wager the player's cards should be tucked under one of the optional side wager bets. These bets will be reconciled at the completion of the hand.
- 5. The dealer reveals the first community card.

- 6. After examining the first community card, each player must then decide to do one of the following:
  - a. Players may to choose to place a second Raise wager. This wager must be 1x, 2x, or 3x their original Ante wager.

OR

- b. Players may choose to Fold. If a player Folds they surrender their Ante wager and first Raise wager.
- 7. The dealer reveals the second community card.
- 8. After examining the second community card, each player must then decide to do one of the following:
  - a. Players may to choose to place a third Raise wager. This wager must be 1x, 2x, or 3x their original Ante wager.

OR

- b. Players may choose to Fold. If a player Folds they surrender their Ante wager, first Raise wager and second Raise wager.
- 9. The dealer reveals the third and final community card.
- 10. Dealer examines each player's hand and pays winning wagers according to the paytable, the dealer also evaluates all optional bonus wagers and pays according to the corresponding paytables.

#### Aggregate Maximum Payout \$50,000 Per Player Per Round (Applies to Ante and Raise Wagers Only)

Full House	11 to 1
Flush	7 to 1
Straight Flush	4 to 1
Three-of-a-Kinda	3 to 1
Two Pair	3 to 2
Pair of Jacks of Better	1 to 1
Pair of 6s to 10s	Push

## **Optional Bonus Wagers**

All bonus wagers must be made prior to the start of the round of play.

### **Board Bonus**

The Board Bonus wins if the three card hand formed by the three community cards consist of a pair of better. Bonuses increase with the ranking of the three card hand.

Hand	Board Bonus Pay Table
Mini-Royal	50 to 1
Straight Flush	40 to 1
Three-of-a-Kind	30 to 1
Straight	6 to 1
Flush	3 to 1
Pair	1 to 1

## Pocket Bonus

The Pocket Bonus wager wins if the player's initial two card hand forms a Pair or an "Ace plus a Face" (Ace/King, Ace/ Queen, or Ace/Jack) hand. Winning Pocket Bonus wagers are paid according the pay table below.

Hand	<b>Board Bonus Pay Table</b>
Pair of Aces	30 to 1
Ace and a King, Queen, or Jack of same suit	20 to 1
Ace and a King, Queen or Jack of different suit	10 to 1
Pair of 2s through Kings	4 to 1

## Lo Ball

The Lo Ball wager wins if the player's five card hand evaluates to a Jack High or Less. And is paid at the odds listed on the pay table below.

Hand	Board Bonus Pay Table
7 High	100 to 1
8 High	50 to 1
9 High	15 to 1
10 High	5 to 1
Jack High	1 to 1
Queen High	Loss

## All Six

The All Six wagers win if the player's six-card hand, formed by combining the player's two cards with the three community cards and the All Six card, forms at least a Three of a Kind, the wager is paid according to the paytable below.

Hand	<b>Board Bonus Pay Table</b>
Royal Flush	1000 to 1
Straight Flush	200 to 1
Four-of-a-Kind	50 to 1
Full-House	25 to 1
Flush	15 to 1
Straight	10 to 1
Three-of-a-Kind	5 to 1
