High Card Flush

The Game

High Card Flush is an exciting new game where you can win up to 1,000 times your wager! After checking your seven cards, bigger flushes mean you can make bigger bets against the dealer! Additionally, win big bonuses for big flushes, and bigger bonuses for straight flushes!

The Play

Play begins when the player makes the mandatory "Ante" wager. At this time, the player may also place a "Flush" and "Straight Flush" side wager. All players and the dealer will be dealt seven cards face-down. The player will evaluate their hand for the number of cards in the biggest flush (2-3-4-5-6 or 7-card flush). For example, a four card flush beats a three card flush.

Second, the player evaluates the hand for the high card ranking for flushes. For example, J-10-4-3 beats 9-7-5-3. Straight flushes do not increase the value of the hand, only the high card.

Each player has the option to raise or fold. If the player folds, they surrender their "Ante" wager. Otherwise, the player will place their 7 cards under their "Raise" wager in the designated area of the table. The player's "Raise" wager amount is determined by the number of cards in the player's biggest flush. The table below lists "Raise" wager amounts.

Raise Amount

Players Hand

1x Ante Bet 2,3 or 4 card Flush

Up to 2x Ante Bet 5 card Flush

Up to 3x Ante Bet 6 or 7 card Flush

If the dealer's hand does not qualify with a 3-card Flush, nine high, the player's "Ante" wager is paid 1 to 1 and the "Raise" wager is a push.



High Card Flush

If the dealer qualifies and the player's hand is higher ranking than the dealer, the player is paid 1 to 1 on his "Ante" and "Raise" wagers. If the player and the dealer have identical Flush hands, the wagers are a push. If the dealer's hand outranks the players hand, the player loses both the "Ante" and "Raise" wager.

The "Flush" and "Straight Flush" side wagers are paid against the paytables below. The player's hand does not have to outrank the dealer's hand in order to win the "Flush" or "Straight Flush" side bets. "Flush" and "Straight Flush" wagers are still eligible to win if a player folds.

The "Flush" bonus wager will be paid at the following posted odds:

Hand	Odds
7 card Flush	400 to 1
6 card Flush	60 to 1
5 card Flush	12 to 1
4 card Flush	1 to 1

The "Straight Flush" bonus wager will be paid at the following posted odds:

Hand	Odds
7 card Straight Flush	1,000 to 1
6 card Straight Flush	500 to 1
5 card Straight Flush	100 to 1
4 card Straight Flush	60 to 1
3 card Straight Flush	8 to 1
